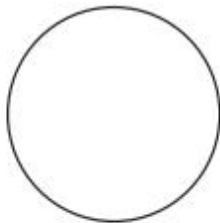

Name one of the parts.

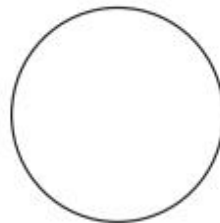
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- ② Pretend the circle is another orange slice. Divide it into four equal parts.
